Local doctors are conducting a research study to evaluate eluxadoline, a medication that has been approved to treat Irritable Bowel Syndrome with Diarrhea (IBS-D) in adults. The purpose of this study is to understand the safety and effectiveness of eluxadoline in people with IBS-D who report that prior use of loperamide (Imodium) did not provide adequate control of their symptoms.

To pre-qualify for this study, you must:

- Be 18 to 80 years of age
- Be diagnosed with IBS-D or have a history of abdominal pain and diarrhea consistent with a diagnosis of IBS-D
- Have used loperamide (Imodium) in the prior 12 months, and use of loperamide did not provide adequate control of your IBS-D symptoms

All study-related visits, tests and treatments will be provided at no cost. In addition, compensation for study-related time and travel may be provided.

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
